## **Eshet Chayil**

As Christmas Day begins its approach, I reflect on the type of person I am regarding this precious Holiday. I can best be described as a person who keeps Christmas in my heart all the year through. I stay in wonder at the birth of Christ, His miraculous coming, and the purposes of God to show us His love by sending His only Son. I think of the far and deep reaching love of Jesus, of His influence, without which we would all perish. Even as a babe that influence was life changing to those he encountered. From the womb to the tomb, from His walk and His talk, He Is Lord, Master and King.

When teaching, I have always loved the use of analogies to bring home a point or objects to help recognize a truth. I had recently been thinking of my Father, Warren Redding. During the last few years of his life, I had the privilege of having a weekly Bible Study with him. One of the most poignant studies we ever shared was from the scripture in Proverbs 31:10. "Who can find a virtuous woman? for her price is far above rubies." My father asked of me this question: "Why Rubies? Why not diamonds or some other gemstone?" The answer came in the form of the object itself, the ruby, AND in the answer as to Who we have in the scriptures that are our shining examples of a virtuous woman; one of the most important being Mary, the mother of Jesus.

First, the ruby. When light enters a ruby it is refracted, meaning it bends as it enters the gemstone, due to the density between air and the ruby crystal, causing the light to split into two beams because rubies are "double refractive" and this splitting combined with the absorption of certain wave lengths (mainly green light) results in the characteristic red color we see in a ruby. The specific way the light interacts with the facets of the cut stone further influences the brilliance and sparkle of the ruby.

We, in this analogy, are the rubies. Christ is the light of the world. As believers, when the light of Christ enters us we are able to truly see the depth and complexity of His love. The color and beauty of His nature is intensified and other people are, literally, able to "see red"...to see Christ, to see that it is His precious blood that atones for our sin and that He is to be glorified. A single light ray entering the gemstone splits into the two rays travelling at slightly different angles. When the light of Christ is in us, that light is also represented in the forms of the Father and the Holy Spirit. He, Christ, being bent and yielded to their work...all three members of the God Head at work in our lives. The Holy Trinity aglow in us. The cutting of the gemstone represents the molding and shaping of ourselves to Christ as we become more like Him.

So then, let's look to the characteristics of a virtuous woman as seen in the context of Proverbs 31. The key to understanding the character of a virtuous woman is in the Hebrew word chayil; which means "might", "bravery", or "success". Being a virtuous person is about letting God show himself through how you interact with your family, take care of your house, your mind-set toward the poor, and in helping your community prosper. And, instead of attributing your success and strength to your own efforts, you give glory to God and praise to Jesus for His sacrifice and work in you. Yet another example of the ruby analogy. Trustworthy, diligent, compassionate, prepared for the future, a good teacher, dedicated to family, the fear of the Lord, brave, generous, competent...are all characteristics of a virtuous person! In the case of Mary, the mother of Jesus, we see through her example deep faith, humility, obedience to God's will, and unwavering love for her son. Recall with me that she, when accepting God's plan, said "Let it be done to me according to your word." She was the first and longest disciple of Jesus! The term Eshet Chayil is generally translated as "Woman of Valor" but applies to all persons when we look at the intent of the heart. So, as we enter into this Season of Holidays, it is my hope we will have the mind-set of being a "ruby" in the sight of our Lord, a precious jewel for His crown and, too, the person of virtue he has called us to be, dedicated to His service, committed to His calling, and glorifying His name.
